

Jumping in to Summer

School's out and summer has begun! We are excited to continue serving our families and the community with summer programs at our Center, with activities in sports, dance, and arts; field trips to fun and exciting locations; and opportunities for continued learning and prep for the fall. Through the transition from the spring, we were blessed to be able to hire 11 new members to our staff team, individuals who are dynamic, skilled, passionate, and eager to grow with us as a Center.

Unprecedented Growth

In planning summer, we were worried that we would have to cap enrollment for our summer programs at 30 students, but through God's grace and providence, as of publication date, we are able to serve 58 youth and their families, 44 in the camp program and 14 as a part of the aviation program!

Taking to the Skies

This summer we are partnering with the New Beginnings Youth Aviation Ministry to provide our middle and high school students the opportunity to explore interest and potential careers in aviation. The program is taught by Dr. Charles Allen, a certified flight instructor, retired Air Force Officer, director with the National Association for Black Veterans, and associate lecturer of chemistry-biochemistry at UWM. We hope this program will produce long-term results of better school engagement for our students, improved reading skills, and serve as a supplement to their Science, Technology, Engineering, and Math (STEM) education. The program also has a spiritual growth component, with opportunities for mentorship and personal development. Programming Designed to Help Children Grow

2018-2019 was the year in which we focused on improving the quality and execution of our programming. Our goal was to ensure that

- Our programming is deliberately developmental such that children had programs that grew with them and encouraged mastery over time;
- Programming is planned and executed by capable and experienced in both their subject matter and in child development;
- Coordinators can dedicate maximum attention and focus to being loving and supportive mentors to our children.

Program improvements included the following:

- Renewed commitment to programming through *Above the Clouds (ATC)*.

 We again hosted drama and added
 - ballet for our 6-9-year-olds;
- Becoming the first non-school partner of *Arts@Large*, a Milwaukee- area non-profit that provides supplemental arts and humanities education services to schools. This year we had classes in vocal arts, e-magazine and graphic design and culinary arts;
- Redoubled efforts to provide

 Science, Technology, Engineering
 & Math
 (STEM)
 content. In
 addition to e-magazine and
 culinary, we taught rocketry,
 videogame design, and aviation,
 and had visits to Discovery World
 and Apple Design studios;

A re-imagined approach to
Spiritual Development to include a
year-long curriculum that guides
our Bible study; ongoing
engagement with Feed My Sheep
and Cru offering exposure to
missions; the third year of our
Winter Retreat "Arctic Blast." We
needed to delay our Mexico
Missions Trip for this summer, but
still plan to take a group of our
teens and high schoolers to
Esperanza Viva in the fall.





We will continue our focus on programmatic excellence. Our children deserve it. In 2019-2020, we will:

- Launch a redesigned Instructional Support Approach:
 We had a soft launch of our
 - We had a soft launch of our approach to Instructional Support intended to a) improve the quality of homework help assistance; b) leverage school-endorsed learning applications; c) provide reading and math support for those who evidence assessed delays;
- Pilot electives: An approach to programming that encourages students and parents to choose the programs in which they participate. In addition to promoting ownership, this approach requires that they commit to finish what they began;
- Encourage Mastery: With a limited number of learning and programmatic offerings, encourage children to move beyond participation to mastery. These offerings will likely be scheduled for non-core Center hours (e.g., Saturdays);


Board Member Spotlight
