

NBAP is using technology to assist in ensuring the safety, health and well-being of all staff, students, and guests during the COVID-19 pandemic. This COVID-19 self-screening software has become an essential part of the way NBAP can track, trace and document in real time.

The daily survey is mandated by the State and

Local Health Departments and a requirement for NBAP before anyone is admitted access/entrance to the facility. Visitors, students and staff will be asked to answer basic questions such as your temperature, symptoms, contact with COVID-19 patients, and recent travel. If for any reason upon answering the questions there is a risk, we must prevent entrance to the center.

COMMITTED TO HEALTH & SAFETY



LETTER FROM OUR EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

WHAT TO DO WHEN YOU CAN'T DO WHAT YOU'VE DONE FOR 24 YEARS

We are celebrating 25 years of service to the Kingdom by...serving. But, as we celebrate this milestone, we are serving in vastly different ways than we have for the first 24 years.

- Since March our Center is empty by 5:30pm when in the past we would be in the middle of serving families by offering a safe afterschool destination. Now, the Center opens at 7:00am to provide a safe and secure place for school.
- In March, our vans were picking up children from 35 schools. Since our vans have been delivering food to the Center for our Food Pantry;
- In March, we had a thriving youth program (ages 6-12). Since, we have launched dynamic partnerships with KPMG (accounting), the Medical College of Wisconsin, the University of Wisconsin (Badger for a Day), All In Milwaukee (College Scholarships) to offer a bright future for our high school students through opportunities for career exploration and access to college scholarships.
- As always, we are offering the Word of God. Since our last update, we have added

a partnership with YoungLife/Wildlife Clubs to meet the spiritual development needs of our middle- and high-schoolers.

COMMUNITY & FAMILY SUPPORT

Our strategy has expanded to draw us to greater fellowship with our neighbors a goal that we have pursued over the past year. Since March, we have launched a community arts project (to be completed in the Spring), and hosted a Havenswood Fall Outdoor Community Social (Distancing) Event. We have also posted a role in partnership with Lutheran Social Services for a Community Engagement Coordinator to bring the full suite of LSS services for mental health, wellness and family support to our community. Our coordinator will work to welcome our community into stronger relationship with New Beginnings Are Possible.



BRIDGE TO ADULTHOOD PARTNERSHIPS

Our high schoolers are in focus at NBAP. We have two exciting new partnerships. The first is with KPMG. KPMG is one of the Top 4 Accounting firms. They are partnering with us to introduce our children to a promising career path that includes advisory services, audit, and tax. The KPMG/NBAP program is being developed by a team of KPMG and NBAP staff. We intend to launch the program in the first quarter of calendar year 2021. The program involves mentoring, career exploration, and active study of principles of finance and accounting. High schoolers are welcome to enroll and explore this indemand career path.

The Medical College of Wisconsin residency program has become an invaluable partner to NBAP and our high schoolers. To begin, the residents donated hygiene supplies to the Center and by extension of our neighbors. In addition, they have developed a curriculum of personal development, image management and branding that began this month. Residents are being recruited to serve as mentors for high schoolers enrolled in the Bridge to Adulthood. We are looking forward to exposing our youth to medical careers when access allows visits to our medical centers.
